Block Placements

Spring and summer terms

Fall or winter term

14 weeks

4 days per week in field, maximum 32 hours per week Supervision for MSW students is required by a social worker with an MSW degree with 2-3 years experience.

Concurrent Placement: Students are in the field 2 days a week, concurrent with classroom learning during the academic year.

Block placements may be considered after successful completion of the coursework.

Distance supervision is allowed, depending on the situation.

## Type and Duration of Placement

#### Master's program

Since September 2007 the undergraduate program leads to the entry-level Professional Master's degree in Occupational and Physical Therapy. This is a 4½-year program. Students with prior undergraduate degrees can enter the program by completing a qualifying year before completing the masters. This will take 26 months. All 4 clinical courses are in the Master's part of the program.

#### Supervision Requirements and Notes

Clinical education courses encompass in excess of 1000 hours and are interwoven into the professional curriculum.

Supervision by an occupational therapist for the OT students/ physical therapist for the PT students, with a minimum of 1 year experience. Clinical educators must be members in good standing with their respective orders.

## Applied Master's program - M.Sc. (A)

2 year master's program with a specialization in speech-language pathology and a minor in audiology. Upon completion, students are eligible to become licensed Speech-Language Pathologists (S-LP) in Canada.

## Supervision Require-

Students must be supervised by a licensed S-LP or audiologist with a minimum of 2 years clinical experience.

Fall and Winter Clinical Placements

■ 20 days divided into 6 short placements completed in various clinical settings (daycare, school, hospital, etc.).

Spring Clinical Placement ■ 20 day block practicum completed primarily in a pediatric setting.

## M2

Fall and Winter Clinical Placements

■Two 12 day practica in a pediatric or adult setting. Each placement is spread over 6 or 12 weeks. 1 placement per semester.

Summer Placement: Final Internship

■ 60 day block internship completed with an adult, pediatric or mixed population.
